Pastor Katie's Notes

Dear RCC,

In three of the gospels—Matthew, Mark, and Luke—Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do people say I am?" And they answer, "Oh, the rumors are that you might be John the Baptist, or Elijah, or one of the other prophets returned to earth." Then Jesus asks the question again—but it's not exactly the same question—"Who do *you* say I am?"



"Who do you say I am?" may be the foundational question for every follower of Jesus. I think Jesus asks it again because he wants his disciples to know that this is a question they must answer for themselves. It's not enough to know what other people think or say about Jesus; we have to be able to answer the question from our own hearts.

Our Lenten worship series this year asks that question: Who do you say I am?

Each week in worship we will explore one of the "I AM" statements Jesus makes about himself in the Gospel of John. He says:

I AM the Bread of Life (March 1)

I AM the Light of the World (March 8)

I AM the Good Shepherd (March 15)

I AM the Vine (March 22)

I AM the Way, the Truth, and the Life (March 29)

I AM the Resurrection and the Life (April 12 – Easter)

These are all different answers to the question, "Who is Jesus?" Each offers us a new way of seeing what Jesus reveals about himself and about God. Each offers us a new way of getting to know Christ for ourselves.

I hope that you will worship with us each Sunday of Lent. I also hope you might consider joining out Lenten Evening Bible Study on Mondays in March at 7 pm, where we will be studying the "I AM" statements even more closely. I hope that when Easter comes, we will each be able to offer our own, unique, faithful answer to Jesus' question: Who do *you* say I am?






HVAC Update
