Pastor Katie's Notes

Dear RCC,

Fall is my favorite season! I love football and sweater weather. I love drinking hot coffee on a chilly morning and coming home to warm soup for dinner. Most of all, I love the colors of fall. Some of the trees in Runnells are already starting to turn yellow, orange, and red and they are stunning.



Years ago I saw a photo of brilliant fall foliage with the caption, "The trees are about to show us just how beautiful it is to let things go." Now I think of these words every year when the seasons change. I think it is a good lesson in resurrection.

The symbols we use for resurrection are often symbols of springtime--flowers popping up through the soil and butterflies emerging from their cocoons. But the trees bud in the spring only after the leaves are dropped in the fall; the tomb is empty only after the cross; new life only comes after death. Fall is a good reminder that some seasons are for letting things go so that new life can grow.

I wonder if we might be in such a season now. I wonder if some of us are carrying things we could let go of, like a grudge that is consuming us or a commitment that is weighing us down. I wonder if our church could be carrying things we could let go of, like a ministry that uses our time and talents but isn't life-giving to our congregation or community anymore. I wonder if sometimes we need to pray for permission, courage, and strength to let things go, trusting that since God brings new life out death, God can bring new life out of these things, too.

If you find yourself in such a season this fall, let the trees remind you that it can be beautiful—and faithful—to let some things go.


